

I purchased this book for my 4 year old daughter to gift to her with a 12" stuffed zebra that she had asked for while in line to see Santa this year. She loved the book and the stuffed animal. The book is a whimsical journey presented in an interview form. Professor Pinstripe has set out to find out how the Zebra got its stripes by interviewing each of the animals in the desert and getting their input and silly stories on how they believe the zebra got its stripes. Many of the Little Golden Books I own are Christian based this one leans more toward just referring to a Supreme "Creator" rather than God. It even refers to "The Creator" several times toward the end. While it's still a cute book I prefer to read my child books with a Christian based theme. Other than that it was a cute story. Being completely fictional I can't really get upset about the "Creator" aspect. It is filled with colorful art and pages that hold my daughter's attention. She even pointed to several of the animals on the pages and asked questions about them.*I paid full price for this book and gifted it as a Christmas gift.

I bought this book for my son's two-year birthday. He loves Zebras, and so I thought he would like this book. When I opened the book for the first time, I was a little concerned because there are many words. I didn't think it would hold his attention. But to my surprise he loved it.
